NATIVE AMERICAN HERITAGE MUSEUM STATE HISTORIC SITE ADJUSTS VISITOR HOURS

HIGHLAND, KS—The Kansas Historical Society announced that it will expand its visitor hours to include Thursday but will not be open on Sunday. The Museum will be open 9 a.m. – 5 p.m. Thursday - Saturday. Private tours may be arranged by calling 785-442-3304 in advance.

About the site: Share in the journey of the Great Lakes Indian tribes who were forced to emigrate to Kansas in the 1800s, adapting their traditional Woodlands cultures to the rolling prairie landscape. At the Museum, once a Presbyterian Mission built in 1845 to educate Iowa and Sac and Fox children, you will find quillwork, baskets and other artwork of present day descendants of emigrant tribes. Through the interactive exhibits, Native Americans tell stories in their own words.
