The Lyons High School at 401 S Douglas Ave, Lyons, Rice County, Kansas, was listed in the National Register of Historic Places on June 9, 2005 for its local significance in the areas of architecture and education under the *Historic Public Schools of Kansas* multiple cover document. Designed by Mann & Company, the 2-1/2 story Art Deco school building was constructed between 1929-1930 by A. Helwig & Sons. This was the first school in the community built to function solely as a high school.

In March 2018, Lyons USD 405 demolished the building after a Kansas Preservation Law review (KSR&C #17-05-077). The loss of the resource negatively affects its historic integrity, and the Kansas State Historic Preservation Office requests the property be removed from the National Register of Historic Places.
