

Kansas Historic Sites Board of Review
Potawatomi Baptist Mission
February 17, 2001

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Chairman Craig Crosswhite. Other board members present were Don Blakeslee, J. Eric Engstrom, Pamela D. Kingsbury, Robert L. Marsh, Billie Porter, Ramon Powers, and Nancy Prawl. Members Mary Adair, Paula Davis, and James E. Sherow were absent. Staff members of the Cultural Resources Division present were Dick Pankratz, Sandy McDaniel, Christy Davis, Martha Hagedorn-Krass, and Carl Magnuson. Interested members of the public were also in attendance.

Eric Engstrom moved to approve the minutes of the December 9, 2000, meeting; Billie Porter seconded the motion and it carried.

Dick Pankratz updated the board on Cultural Resources Division (CRD) activities since the December meeting. Two properties have been added to the National Register of Historic Places—the Ottawa High School and Middle School, Ottawa, Franklin County; and Doyle Place, Florence vicinity, Marion County. With the addition of these two listings, the National Register property total is now 710.

Work is underway on the contractual agreement for a survey and context study on New Deal projects in Dickinson and Crawford counties.

Final applications for FY 2001 Heritage Trust Fund (HTF) grant monies are due March 1, 2001. Chairman Crosswhite will appoint a committee from the board to review the applications after we have received them in our office. The committee's report will be considered at the May meeting. Carl Magnuson gave a short report to the board on HTF application workshops that have been held around the state.

Christy Davis spoke to the board on House Bill 2128, which would provide for a state tax incentive on historic preservation projects for privately owned historic structures. Ms. Davis also updated the board on the building doctor workshops which are being held around the state to provide technical assistance to historic property owners.

Ramon Powers updated the board on legislative matters concerning the Historical Society. A bill will be introduced into the House appropriations committee concerning governance issues between the state operations and private side of the Society.

Ramon said there will likely be some major activity this year concerning the state capitol restoration project. The Society is nearing completion of a planning process identifying critical issues that it faces, such as lack of resources for teaching Kansas history in schools, declining monetary resources, the challenge of the digital information age, and the state's deteriorating historical treasures.

Dick addressed the board concerning the issue of property naming that has been

discussed at previous board meetings. CRD staff has taken the matter under advisement and in the future will follow the National Park Service (NPS) guidelines for naming properties.

Eric Engstrom informed the board that the Eaton Hotel restoration project is nearing completion.

Consideration of the federal fiscal year 2001 Historic Preservation Fund grant applications was next on the agenda. The review committee members were Bob Marsh, Craig Crosswhite, and Billie Porter. Bob Marsh read the committee recommendations and moved to accept the report; Eric Engstrom seconded the motion and it carried. That report is attached to these minutes.

After a ten-minute recess the board considered nominations for the national register/state register. Those nominations were accepted unanimously unless otherwise noted.

REPORT OF THE GRANTS REVIEW COMMITTEE TO THE KANSAS
HISTORIC SITES BOARD OF REVIEW, FEBRUARY 17, 2001

On Thursday February 8, 2001 the Historic Preservation Fund grants review committee, which was composed of Craig Crosswhite, Bob Marsh, and myself, Billie Porter, met with staff of the Historic Preservation Office to discuss our rankings of the eligible applications for the Historic Preservation Fund grants for fiscal year 2001. They were as follows:

- Glasco Community Foundation, Request for Consultant for Historic Designation Assistance, \$2,420

The committee ranked the proposals according to the stated criteria and recommended funding to the highest rated proposals. As is required by the National Park Service, a minimum of ten per cent of the gross federal appropriation is reserved for CLG projects. May 19, 2001

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Vice-Chairman Mary Adair in the absence of Chairman Craig Crosswhite. Other board members present were Paula Davis, J. Eric Engstrom, Pamela D. Kingsbury, Robert L. Marsh, Billie Porter, Ramon Powers, and Nancy Prawl. Absent board members included Don Blakeslee, Craig Crosswhite, and Jim Sherow. Staff members of the Cultural Resources Division present were Dick Pankratz, Sandy McDaniel, Cathy Ambler, Will Banks, Christy Davis, Martha Hagedorn-Krass, Carl Magnuson.

Billie Porter moved to approve the minutes of the February 17, 2001, meeting; Nancy Prawl seconded the motion. The February minutes were approved as amended to include comments made by Bob Marsh about a possible conflict between the state law and federal guidelines.

Dick Pankratz updated the board on Cultural Resources Division (CRD) activities since the February board meeting. The National Register of Historic Places now has 734 listings. New entries include: the 15 Lustron homes, the Nokomis, Navarre, and Virginia apartment buildings in Wichita, the Marshall-Yohe House in Lincoln, the Clark-Robidoux House in Wallace, St. Mary's Catholic Church in Purcell, Marion Hall in Baileyville, the Topeka Cemetery-Mausoleum Row in Topeka, the Kuhrt Ranch in the Edson vicinity, and the Wolcott House in Mission Hills.

Ramon Powers reported that the Kansas legislature passed house bill 2128 which established a state tax credit for rehabilitating historic Kansas properties. The legislature also passed legislation on the governance of the Historical Society, established a territorial sesquicentennial committee, and approved ongoing preservation of the State Capitol. Also passed was a bill authorizing the acceptance of the William Allen White House and grounds in Emporia as a state site, but with the stipulation that no state funds be used for the operation of the site. The Society will work with a group in Emporia on a development plan for the property. Bob Marsh suggested that the name be changed to the Sally and William A. White House.

Christy Davis gave the board an overview on the newly passed state tax incentives bill. CRD staff, with the help of Steve Phillips from the attorney general's office, are in the process of writing rules and regulations. Board members Pamela D. Kingsbury and Bob Marsh expressed concern that there might be an unusual increase in the number of persons seeking state and national register status in order to receive state tax incentives.

Cathy Ambler reported that we have four vacancies in our division at the present time. We are in the process of searching or interviewing for the positions of architectural historian, archeologist, certified local government/state tax credit coordinator, and architect. Cathy has also tendered her resignation. Her last day with the Cultural Resources Division will be May 29.

Next on the agenda was the consideration of FY 2001 Historic Preservation Fund (HPF) grant applications. A second round of grant money was available for FY 2001 because of the dramatic increase in federal funding for Kansas from the National Park Service Historic Preservation Fund. The committee reviewing the applications was composed of Billie Porter, chair, Eric Engstrom, and Jim Sherow. Carl Magnuson, grants manager, read the list of applicants to determine if any board members had a conflict of interest. Pamela Kingsbury declared a conflict with the application submitted by the City of Wichita for an Architectural Styles Workshop and left the room during the vote. Billie Porter read the report of the review committee and made a motion to accept the report; Nancy Prawl seconded the motion and it carried. That report is attached to these minutes. Bob Marsh commented that he wondered why the application from the Friends of the Free State Capitol for an Historic Site Survey of 427, 429, and 431 Kansas Ave., in Topeka was not funded. Staff replied that the proposed project work did not meet the HPF guidelines. Ramon stated he had an interest in the project and will try to establish a working relationship with the Friends group.

Heritage Trust Fund (HTF) applications for FY 2001 were presented to the board for their consideration by the HTF grants review committee. The committee was composed of board members Pamela D. Kingsbury, chair, Mary Adair, and Nancy Prawl. Carl read the list of applicants to determine if any board member had a conflict of interest. Eric Engstrom declared a conflict in regard to the application for the Orpheum Theater in Wichita and left the room during the vote. Ms. Kingsbury read the report of the review committee and made a motion to accept the report. Carl then presented slides of the recommended projects. Following discussion by the board, Bob Marsh seconded the motion and it carried. That report is attached to these minutes.

After a ten-minute recess the board considered nominations for the national register/state register. The nominations were accepted unanimously unless otherwise noted.

Kansas Historic Sites Board of Review
Kansas History Center
August 18, 2001

Chairman Craig Crosswhite called the meeting of the Kansas Historic Sites Board of Review to order at 9:30 a.m. Other board members present were Mary Adair, Donald Blakeslee, J. Eric Engstrom, Pamela D. Kingsbury, Bob Marsh, Billie Porter, Ramon Powers, Nancy Prawl, and James Sherow. Board member Paula Davis was absent. Staff members of the Cultural Resources Division present were Dick Pankratz, Teresa Kiss, Martha Hagedorn-Krass, Carl Magnuson, and Robert Hoard.

Eric Engstrom moved to approve the minutes of the May 19, 2001, meeting; Nancy Prawl seconded the motion, and the May minutes were approved.

The board's rules of procedure call for the election of two officers, the chair and the vice chair, at the first meeting following July 1. Pamela D. Kingsbury moved to retain the current officers, Chairman Craig Crosswhite and Vice-chairman Mary Adair. Bob Marsh seconded the motion. There was unanimous approval of the motion to retain the current officers.

Dick Pankratz updated the board on Cultural Resources Division (CRD) activities since the May board meeting. The National Register of Historic Places now has 741 listings. New entries include: St. Mary's Catholic Church at Purcell, Doniphan County; Marion Hall, Baileyville, Nemaha County; Mausoleum Row, Topeka Cemetery, Topeka, Shawnee County; Kuhrt Ranch, Edson vicinity, Sherman County; Clark-Roubidoux House, Wallace, Wallace County; Wolcott House, Mission Hills, Johnson County; Fort Fletcher Stone Arch Bridge, Walker vicinity, Ellis County; and the Hotel Sunflower Presbyterian Church, St. John's Episcopal Church, and the United Building, all in Abilene, Dickinson County.

Dick reported on progress of the new state tax credits. The regulations have gone to the Attorney General's office for approval and then will go to the Department of Administration. Then they will be considered by a legislative committee and hopefully approved as temporary regulations. Application forms are ready to go into use as soon as the regulations are approved. The Department of Revenue has also prepared a form that will be part of the state income tax packet. Any questions may be directed to Christy Davis in the CRD office.

Dick addressed additional staffing for the CRD with the increased federal funding; 3.5 positions are being added. Jennifer Epperson, Archeologist and Project Reviews, started the end of July; Katrina Klingaman, Historic Preservation Specialist, will start in a week and will be working with Christy Davis on state and federal tax credits. The office is still seeking to add an architectural historian/historian to work with Martha Hagedorn-Krass on nominations. The division will be adding a half-time office assistant, Patty Morgan, a retired former employee of the agency's fiscal office, to help Carl Magnuson with federal grant programs on September 4, 2001. Existing positions

include hiring an architect, Bruce Wrightsman, from Manhattan, to fill the Heritage Trust Fund architect position, and he, too, will start on September 4. The full time position formerly held by Cathy Ambler is still vacant; however, State Archeologist Robert Hoard is now serving as Acting Assistant Division Director in addition to his State Archeologist duties.

Dick reported on the progress of the courthouse and railroad depot thematic nominations. The railroad nominations were sent to Washington last week, but Courthouse nominations are making slow progress. Additionally, work on the New Deal context and nominations are underway.

The Santa Fe Long Distance Trails Office of the National Park Service has funds for special projects relating to Route 66. We applied for and have been awarded \$15,000, with no matching funds requirement, to conduct a survey, prepare a National Register multiple property context statement, and prepare 3-5 National Register nominations, to cover the 13 miles of Route 66 in Kansas. An RFP will be issued through the state's purchasing division once we have a signed agreement with the National Park Service.

The Midwest SHPO staff conference scheduled for Wichita the last week of August was cancelled for lack of registrations from other states. A tax incentives conference on September 12, 2001, in Topeka is scheduled for developers, architects, accountants, and city officials; it will focus on the federal credits. An IRS representative, a National Park Service representative, and individuals with experience completing projects are scheduled as presenters.

Martha Hagedorn-Krass reported that the Historic Bridges Conference will be held in Topeka on November 8, 2001. It will include engineers and presenters from across the country and is targeted at professional engineers. A registration application is in the recent edition of the *Kansas Preservation* newsletter.

Carl Magnuson informed the board of the upcoming Heritage Trust Fund (HTF) workshops. Five workshops are scheduled across the state; Topeka (2), Wichita, Hays, and Pleasanton. HTF applications will be available in September for the March 1, 2002, deadline. Historic Preservation Fund Grants have a November 16, 2001, deadline.

Dick Pankratz updated the board on endangered properties in the state. The Leavenworth Veterans Administration project has slowed as they have a new director who is not rushing to demolition. The Ottawa school board this week set a date in March 2002, for a hearing on demolition of the Ottawa Middle School. It was noted developers still have time to act on the property. The city of Junction City sent a letter requesting that the Bartell House be removed from the National Register. The State Historic Preservation Officer advised the city that they would need to show that the reasons for which the building had been nominated were no longer valid. That can't be done, so the latest word is the city is again talking with a potential developer.

8/18/01

Robert Hoard was introduced as the State Archeologist and Acting Assistant Division Director for the CRD. Hoard presented his archeological background and gave a brief overview of archeology programs at KSHS, including Kansas Archeology Week, Kansas Archeology Training Program field school, Native American Grave Protection Repatriation Act (NAGPRA), Unmarked Burial Sites, storage of artifacts, and work for the Kansas Department of Transportation.

Ramon Powers announced to the board his anticipated retirement in March. He also addressed the issue of the Free State Capitol properties in the 400 block of Kansas Avenue that the board had discussed in May. He stated an experienced architect has recently examined the building and that a contract historian will be looking at the buildings' history. He reported that the state is facing rough fiscal times. Agencies are being required to submit a budget for 2003 with three levels; current level, 2% reduction, and 4% reduction cuts. He stated he would not recommend a reduction in staff, particularly with the upcoming change in agency director.

After a ten-minute recess the board reconvened at 10:15 to consider nominations for the National Register / State Register.

December 1, 2001

Chairman Craig Crosswhite called the meeting of the Kansas Historic Sites Board of Review to order at 9:30 a.m. Other board members present were Donald Blakeslee, Paula Davis, J. Eric Engstrom, Bob Marsh, Billie Porter, Ramon Powers, Nancy Prawl, David Sachs, and James Sherow. Board member John Hoopes was absent. Staff members of the Cultural Resources Division present were Dick Pankratz, Will Banks, Christy Davis, Jennifer Epperson, Martha Hagedorn-Krass, Teresa Kiss, Katrina Klingaman, Carl Magnuson, and Bruce Wrightsman.

Board members were introduced. Since the last meeting, two new board members have been appointed to replace Pamela Kingsbury and Mary Adair. David Sachs from Manhattan, who replaces Pamela Kingsbury, was introduced. Craig Crosswhite has also been reappointed to a three-year term.

Eric Engstrom moved to approve the minutes of the August 18, 2001, meeting; Don Blakeslee seconded the motion, and the August minutes were approved.

The board's rules of procedure call for the election of two officers, the chair and the vice chair, at the first meeting following July 1. That election was held at the August 18, 2001 meeting. Subsequently, the person elected as vice chair, Mary Adair, was replaced so a new election was held. Bob Marsh nominated Eric Engstrom for vice chair and Don Blakeslee seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Dick Pankratz updated the board on Cultural Resources Division (CRD) activities since the August board meeting. The National Register of Historic Places now has 752 listings. New entries include: The Railroad Resources of Kansas Multiple Property Submission including five depots: Atchison SF Freight Depot, Halstead SF Depot, Kingman SF Depot, Council Grove MKT Depot, and Downs MP Depot. Additional new entries include: Witter McCurdy House, Lawrence; Eugene F. Goodrich House, Lawrence; Little John Creek Reserve, Council Grove vicinity; Bailey Hall, KU, Lawrence; Curtis Jr. High, Topeka; and Auld Stone Barn, Wakefield vicinity.

Christy Davis reported on the progress of the state tax credits rules and regulations. Governor Graves signed HB 2128 on April 16, 2001. Temporary regs were passed September 5, 2001, at which time the Historic Preservation Office began accepting applications. Since April, Christy Davis and Katrina Klingaman have spoken at various workshops across the state to approximately 500 people about the new tax credits program.

Katrina Klingaman showed slides and discussed various state tax credit projects submitted to the Historic Preservation Office. Eight projects, mostly residential, are currently under way or under review.

Dick addressed additional staffing for the CRD. Since the last board meeting, Jennifer Epperson, Katrina Klingaman, and Bruce Wrightsman have joined the Historic Preservation Office. Each new staff member presented a brief introduction of their position with the CRD and their background. An architectural historian will begin after the first of the year and a new secretary is scheduled to begin on December 13.

Martha Hagedorn-Krass provided a summary of the Historic Bridges conference on November 8. The conference was quite technical, attended mostly by engineers, and was successful. Bob Marsh, who had attended the workshop, also commented on its value.

Carl Magnuson informed the board on the status of the current round of Heritage Trust Fund Grants. Four of the six workshops have been presented and there has been a high level of interest. \$750,000 are slated to be awarded. Heritage Preservation Fund requests are in but at this time he is unsure of the level of appropriations from the Federal Government.

Dick noted that this board meeting constituted the 100th meeting of the Kansas Historic Sites Board of Review and provided some historical information about the board and its formation.

Dick called the board's attention to the Historical Marker booklet that was a joint project between the Historical Society and KDOT. Copies were included in board packets and made available to the public.

Ramon Powers remarked on the importance of KDOT to preservation projects. He noted society projects such as Shawnee Mission in Fairway had benefited from KDOT funding. Ramon noted progress in acquiring the William Allen White House. The Historical Society is in the process of getting the property transferred. Ramon also observed that historic sites in Baldwin City area in Douglas County are threatened by development and he will work as an advocate for the properties. Ramon addressed the problem with the Free State Capitol group noting a division within the group on the basic issue of what exactly is eligible. Ramon noted that the building that exists is the building that is eligible for National Register listing and he will provide more information as the project progresses. Ramon stated his last meeting on the board would be the February 2002 meeting.

After a five-minute recess, the board reconvened at 10:20 to consider nominations for the National Register / State Register.
